DEAR EDITOR,—I beg to call your attention to pages 2 and 5 of the *Pall Mall Gazette* of October 22nd. On page 2, Mr. Samuel Laing gives an account of an Irishman and his family, seven in all, managing to exist on food that cost "2 1/2d. per day."
